

During the investigation of a residential Burglary reported on 10/15/14, it was confirmed that the prescription drug Darvon were stolen.

The suspect was later identified & located on 10/22/14. Upon contact with the suspect, he was observed taking pills. A search warrant was obtained for a blood draw to determine what drug he consumed. It was verified that the drug was Darvon the same drug stolen during the Burglary. The person was then arrested for the Possession of dangerous drugs & Burglary.

The property entries for the 10/15/14 Burglary incident #1 would be <u>stolen</u> <u>drugs</u> with a <u>property value</u>.

What property information would be reported for the Possession of dangerous drug offense?

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The 10/22/14 Possession of dangerous drug incident #2 would include the following property information:

## Type of Property Loss = 1, None

If a drug offense is completed then the Type of Property Loss can only be (**1**, **None** or 6, Seized).

## Suspected Drug Type = H, Other Narcotics

If a drug offense has a 1, None Type of Property Loss then a Suspected Drug Type <u>must</u> be entered.

This applies to drugs that offenders flushed down a toilet, swallowed, or the LEA used as part of an undercover investigation.

Information for Estimated Drug Quantity & Type of Drug Measurement should not be entered with the Type of Property Loss of 1, None.
