

☀️ CAMPP MT will work collaboratively with Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS); Office of Public Instruction (OPI); UM Center for Children, Families and Workforce Development (CCFWD); Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) and community organizations to provide resources to inmates and their families throughout the program.

☀️ We will work with OPI to provide resources for children in public schools. They will monitor children in the program to be alert for any adverse behaviors and then refer them to the appropriate professionals to address these behaviors.

☀️ We will work in partnership with DPHHS regarding children who are currently in foster care to help successfully transition them back to home placement and reunification with their parents.

☀️ To ensure incarcerated parents continue to hone and maintain their skills, they will be required to complete at least 3 Toolkit trainings developed by CCFWD that will be available to inmates on their tablets.

CAMPP MT



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 CAMPP MT is a 12-week program that will focus on evidence-based programming for inmates, while at the same time offering resources and support for families. CAMPP MT looks forward to working with involved families to identify and address how parenting and trauma can affect all areas of their life and their children's lives.

 The parents will learn to correct these parenting behaviors which will have a significant effect on themselves, their children both at home and school, which will ultimately lead to a positive and successful reunification process.




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CAMPP MT will culminate with a 3-day family camp to be held in a safe, family friendly space on the MSP/MCE campus. Families will come during the day and participate in activities with their fathers that are designed to begin the reunification process through positive bonding and communication. Some activities include writing and performing skits, exercises in journaling thoughts and feelings to be shared with a counselor, creating a family mural, crafts, cooking classes, and scavenger hunts.



 During the entire program, inmates' eligibility will be continually assessed by program staff so that the reunification of parent and child is safe and positive for all involved.

 CAMPP MT staff will maintain regular contact with children and their caregivers to ensure they feel safe and want to continue participating. We will be available to answer questions and address any concerns.

 CAMPP MT will provide travel assistance, over-night lodging, and meals for families during the camp, and for families who have to travel from their community to MSP/MCE for the camp.
