Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) for State Prisoners Program and
Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Site-based Program (COAP)

RSAT Objectives:

- Enhance the capabilities of states and units of local and tribal governments to provide residential substance abuse treatment for incarcerated inmates.
- Prepare individuals for reintegration into communities.
- Assist individuals and communities through the reentry process by delivering community-based treatment and other broad-based aftercare services.

Types of RSAT Programs

- **Residential program** which engages inmates for a period of between 6 and 12 months.
- **Jail-based program** which engages inmates for at least 3 months.
- Individuals who participate in the substance abuse treatment program under RSAT must be provided with **aftercare services**.

RSAT Requirements:

- Implement programs based on effective scientific practices.
- Focus on the inmate's substance abuse diagnosis and addiction-related needs.
- Develop the inmate's behavioral, cognitive, social, vocational, and other skills to solve the substance abuse and related problems.

RSAT Requirements:

- Prepare inmates for successful community reintegration, including post-release referral to appropriate evidence-based aftercare treatment and/or service providers including those that support the use of medication-assisted treatment.
- Implement and/or continue to require urinalysis or other proven reliable forms of testing, including both periodic and random testing:
 - (1) of an offender before the offender enters a residential substance abuse treatment program;
 - (2) during the period in which the offender participates in the treatment program; and
 - (3) of an offender released from a residential substance abuse treatment program if the offender remains in the custody of the state.
